Meditating on Scripture —

A. Pray the Bible Outloud to God Everyday!

Why pray the Word? It feeds you (Matt. 4:4), washes you (Eph. 5:26-27), sanctifies you (John 17:17), disciplines you (Heb. 4:12-13), releases grace and peace, builds your faith, and equips you (2 Tim. 3:16-17).

Joshua 1:8 (NIV) “Do not let this Book of the Law depart from your mouth; meditate in it day and night, so that you may be careful to do everything written in it. Then you will be prosperous and successful.”

Psalms 1:2-3 (NIV), “But his delight is in the law of the Lord, and on his law he meditates day and night. 3 He is like a tree planted by streams of water, which yields its fruit in season and whose leaf does not wither. Whatever he does prospers.”

B. Re-writing our spiritual code by declaring the Scriptures

Each time we say what God says, it marks us and changes us. John 6:63, “The words that I speak to you are spirit and they are life.

1. Set a Schedule for regular prayer times,
2. Make a prayer list, and
3. Have a right view of God.

A schedule establishes “When” we will pray. A prayer list gives us focus on “what” to pray. A right view of God causes us to “want” to pray.

C. Take a passage of Scripture and begin to turn it into a dialogue with Jesus, talking and listening.

1. Take time to linger in his presence. Maybe start with some worship music in the background. Speak affectionately by intermittingly saying, “I love you” Speak slowly and softly, briefly (short phrases not paragraphs).

2. Listen to God

Read the Word aloud several times.

Meditate on the scripture as it connects to your life. How is God speaking into your circumstances?

Pray as a response to how the Lord is speaking, by asking for forgiveness or guidance. Rest in His love. What is God leading you to?

Contemplate in stillness. Rest in God’s presence. Stay open and listen to God speak through his word. How is He revealing himself to you?

D. Pray-Read Scripture

1. When you come to truths exhorting you to believe:

Thank Jesus for the reality represented in the specific passage.

Ask Him to reveal in a greater way the specific passage being read.

2. When you come to truths exhorting you to obey:

Commit yourself to obey what the specific passage describes.

Ask Him to empower you to obey what the

word says.

F. ARK Prayer Tool

Agreement: Make declarations of agreement to Jesus about who He is (titles, names), what He's like (attributes) and what He feels, says or does (emotions, words, actions).

1. "You are...the faithful witness, the Firstborn from the dead, Ruler over the Kings of the earth," etc.

2. "You have...eyes like a flame of fire, a sharp two-edged sword," etc.

3. "You do...hold the seven stars in Your right hand, dwell in the midst of the churches," etc.

Revelation: Ask the Holy Spirit for increased revelation of these specific aspects of Jesus' majesty.

John 16:13, "When He, the Spirit of Truth, has come, He will guide you into all truth... He will glorify Me, for he will take of what is Mine (thoughts, emotions, etc) and declare (reveal) it to you.

Keep the Word: Make simple declarations by the grace of God to resolve to guard the truths, while asking God to empower us to faithfully express these aspects of Jesus' character in our lives and ministries, whether resisting temptation, enduring suffering or persecution or simply overcoming the mundane seasons of routine life.

E. Promises of Answered Prayer

Now this is the confidence that we have in Him, that if we ask anything according to His will, he hears us. And if we know that He hears us, whatever we ask, we know that we have the petitions that we have asked of Him. - 1 John 5:14

The effective, fervent prayer of a righteous man avails much. - James 5:16

If any of you lacks wisdom, let him ask God, who gives generously to all. -James 1:5

Call to me and I will answer you, and will tell you great and hidden things that you have not known. -Jeremiah 33:3

If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will the heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to those who ask him. -Luke 11:13

If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness. -1 John 1:9

Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours. -Mark 11:24

If you abide in me, and my words abide in you, ask whatever you wish, and it will be done for you. -John 15:7

Gospel Promises —

“The Gospel is the news that Jesus Christ, the Righteous King, died for our sins and rose again, eternally triumphant over all his enemies, so that there is now no condemnation for those who believe, but only everlasting joy.”—John Piper

The Gospel is the good news that God’s kingdom power has entered human history through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ. When we repent and rely on his righteousness instead of our own, his kingdom power transforms us and we become participants in the restoration of God’s world. The three aspects of the gospel are the kingdom, the cross, and God’s grace.

- The gospel of the kingdom is life with God under God’s rule
- The gospel of the cross is the life, death and resurrection of Jesus by which God accomplishes our salvation, rescues us from his wrath, incorporates us into his people, and inaugurates his reign in the world.
- The gospel of grace is the wonderful news that God accepts us, shares his life with us, and adopts us as heirs of his kingdom not because we have earned it or deserve it, but because God chooses to give all of this freely at Christ’s expense. - Daniel Montgomery

God’s Mercy,

Mercy is Not getting what we deserve. He took the wrath that we deserved, he took the punishment of our sin in our place.

“But God being rich in mercy, because of

the great love with which he loved us,” Eph. 2:4

God’s Grace,

Grace is getting what we don’t deserve. Acceptance, Belonging, Forgiveness of Sin, Eternal Life, All-satisfying Joy, Adoption, the Gift of the Spirit, etc. His grace is freely given and it was given at Christ’s expense on the cross!

“And God is able to make all grace about to you, so that having all sufficiency in all things at all times, you may abound in every good work” 2 Cor. 9:8

“For you know the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, that though he was rich, yet for your sakes he became poor, so you by his poverty might become rich” 2 Cor. 8:9

Lord's Prayer —

"Pray then like this: "Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name. Your kingdom come, your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil" (Matt. 6:9-13).

Our Father in Heaven

- Come to Papa! Picture him on his throne (Rev. 4-5) in heaven with a smile.

Your Name be Hallowed

- Make yourself real on the earth. The verb hallowed has the sense of praise, honor, exalt, to revere, to glorify, and to reveal. Name means who God is and what God is like(character, personality, fame, glory, renown, reputation)
- Father, Enhance your reputation, that your name would be treated as infinitely valuable on earth as it is in heaven. May your name be REVEALED, so that... it will be REVERED

Your Kingdom Come

- Father ACT as KING. Rule without Rival.
- Kingdom is the sphere of his reign and rule. The king's domain. His Dominion, His Government. His scepter of righteous rule and justice.
- Submit to him and ask for his Lordship in each area of your life.

Your Will Be Done

- Fulfill all your good pleasures. Make his will your will.
- God's will that we be filled with the Spirit

(Eph. 5:18), be sanctified(I Thess 4:3), pray continuously, give thanks in all things, and rejoice always(I Thess 5:16-18).

Give us this Day our Daily Bread

- Be our provider. Thank God for provision and ask him for increase physically, spiritually, emotionally, financially, relationally.
- Meditate on the cross, the place of ultimate provision.

Forgive us our Debts (sins)

- Cancel all our debts, give us a clean slate. Reveal any sin, wrongful attitude.

As we forgive others debts (sins) against us

- Ask God to reveal those who have hurt or wounded you and forgive them as Jesus forgave you. Give them a clean slate, as if they don't owe you anything. Pray for your enemies.

Lead us not into temptation

- Rescue Us! Confess need for God and his protection from temptation.

Deliver us from the evil one

- Put on the Armor of God
"Finally, be strong in the Lord and in the strength of his might. Put on the whole armor of God that you may be able to stand against the schemes of the devil. For we do not wrestle against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the cosmic powers over this present darkness, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly places. Therefore

take up the whole armor of God that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm. Stand therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth, and having put on the breastplate of righteousness, and, as shoes for your feet, having put on the readiness given by the gospel of peace. In all circumstances take up the shield of faith, with which you can extinguish all the flaming darts of the evil one; and take the helmet of salvation, and the sword of the Spirit, which is the word of God, praying at all times in the Spirit, with all prayer and supplication.”

- 1. Belt of Truth**
- 2. Breastplate of righteousness**
- 3. Feet shod w/gospel of peace**
- 4. Shield of Faith (Word of His Grace releases Faith)**
- 5. Helmet of Salvation (Preach the Gospel to Yourself)**
- 6. Sword of the Spirit (Wield the Word through prayer)**
- 7. Pray in the Spirit on all occasions**

Lord's Prayer Guide

When Jesus gave us instruction on how to pray, He expected we would obey it! Not in a rote manner of simply memorizing it and reciting it, but to use it as a pattern for our prayers. Throughout history great leaders in the Church of Jesus Christ have found this to be true: your best prayers will come as you obey Him and rely upon His Spirit to bring

brand new prayers from this very old prayer.

Our Father, In Heaven

Notice, first of all, that He invites us to call Him “Our Father” (or “Papa”). He could have required that we bow low, keep our distance, and refer to Him as “Creator” or “Just Judge” or “The Most Holy One.” He is all these things! But He invites us to speak to Him as His children; as family members. Remember this relationship as you pray. In certain ways, we are like Him and He is like us. We are close to Him and He is close to us.

But also notice that He is “in Heaven.” Even though we are His children and we are like Him in certain ways, He is also totally unlike us! He is close to us, but He is also far above us! Apart from the work of Jesus at the cross, He would be totally unapproachable! We would have no access to Him.

As we pray, remember the balance that He is both like us and close to us as well as totally unlike us and far above us! We can approach Him with confidence but we should never be casual while doing so.

There are two parts to this prayer. You can see this by the use of the pronoun “Your” in the first portion and “us” in the second. Requests 1-3 make up the first part and requests 4-7 make up the second.

The “Your” portion

The first three request Jesus directed us to are not about us, our city, or other earthly issues. They are about three big themes on God's heart.

- 1) Let Your name [Your character, Your nature, Your reputation... etc.] Be holy [be revealed, be revered, be received... etc.]

2) Let Your kingdom [Your rule, Your government, Your reign... etc.] Come [be established, be expanded, be embraced... etc.]

3) Let Your will [Your desires, Your plans, Your purposes... etc.] Be done [be known, be accomplished, be accepted... etc.]

As you pray in this manner, add four key phrases.

- **“To me” can be added to the first line.**
- **“In me” can be added to the second line**
- **“By me” can be added to the third line**
- **And “Through me” can be added to each line.**

So the lines could sound like this:

- **Let Your name be holy to me so it can be holy through me.**
- **Let Your kingdom come in me so it can come through me.**
- **Let Your will be done by me so it can be done through me.**

And because we can pray this “in the plural” it can turn into...

- **Let Your name be more holy to Your church [in my city... etc.] so it can be seen as holy through Your church to those around us.**
- **Let Your kingdom come more fully in Your church [in my city... etc.] so it can come through Your church to those around us.**
- **Let Your will be done more completely by Your church [in my city... etc.] so it can be done through Your church to those around us.**

Finally, end each line with the following phrases.

- **On earth [in my home, my community, my city... etc.]**

- **As it is in Heaven [as it is where You are, in Your home, at Your place... etc.]**

The “us” portion

Requests 4-7 focus on four big needs of mankind. Having prayed that which is most important to God, we now turn toward what we need most.

- 4) Give us [we are not demanding, we are asking] this day [this phrase can be added to all 7 requests – we are in constant need] our daily bread [that which we really need, physically, emotionally, and especially spiritually]. We need Your provision and You are the best provider ever!
- 5) Forgive us [based solely upon the work of Jesus at the cross] our debts [that which we rightfully owe You and others] as we forgive [releasing, pardoning, no longer punishing, or requiring anything from them] our debtors [all who have hurt us in any way]. We need Your pardon and You are the best forgiver ever!
- 6) Lead us [direct us, guide us... when we know Your direction and when we don't] not into temptation [anything that I may see as a substitute for fullness in Jesus, anything that seeks to take Jesus' place in my life]. We need Your direction and You are the best leader ever!
- 7) But deliver us [keep us away from, nullify every scheme, break every weapon] from the evil one [the one who hates You and us, the one who seeks to steal, kill, and destroy us]. We need Your protection and You are the best protector ever!

Because we can pray this “in the plural” it can turn into...

Give Your church in my city everything it

needs today. Let them look to You and You alone for their provision. Give them physical bread. Beyond that, give them wisdom, give them grace, give them love, give them peace. Then, give them fresh bread from Your word. Give them today's "manna." But most of all, give them more of Your Son, the bread from heaven!

And convince Your church of the value of forgiving. Convince us to quickly and fully release anyone who has sinned against us. Then grant us the forgiveness that we need as well. Let there be nothing between You and us.

Then, Father, lead Your church onto the path You have for her. Don't let us wander away, but let us have ears to hear what you are saying and a heart to respond to Your nudges as well as Your clear voice.


Finally, free Your church from every influence of the evil one. Let Your plans override his plans. Keep every believer in close, tight relationship with You. Use Your Word and Your Spirit to keep us on Your path.

Praying God's Purposes from the Lord's Prayer


Even though there is a "Your" portion and an "us" portion of this prayer, the two parts are directly related. The primary reason for the "us" portion is not simply to satisfy our big needs. It is to accomplish the three big themes on God's heart! God never intended that we would pray the "us" requests simply to meet our own needs. We are to pray the requests of the second part so that the requests of the first part would be accomplished "on earth as it is in Heaven!"

This can be illustrated and prayed by looking at the two charts below. We will start with

the requests of the second part and relate them to the first part. In each space (where the word "us" would appear) fill in a person or group in your city.



Now, we will begin with the first part and relate it to the second part.



A Prayer Guide for Your Local Church _____

At _____ Church

Prayer is key to church health and vitality. Jesus urged his followers to ask, seek and knock promising that those who did would receive, find, and have doors opened to them. (Matt. 7:7-8). The New Testament Church could not have been the vital, healthy, strong, expansive church that it was without devotion to prayer (Acts 1:14, 2:42, 6:4, Rom. 12:12, Eph. 6:18, Col. 4:2). Neither can _____-Church.

All of the prayer prompts in this Prayer Guide are rooted in Scripture. To pray them is to lay hold of the promises of God for the purposes of God in the lives of the people of God.

Ways to use this prayer guide:

First, prepare your heart for pray by confession. Prayers that come from an impure heart harboring un-confessed sin are not “heard” by God. They’re a waste of time. Let the Spirit cleanse your heart.

Second, spend time in praise & thanks. That will get your heart and mind focused on God, an important pre-requisite to fervent prayer.

Third, use the rest of the Prayer Guide to pray for _____ Church as together we seek to transform lives and build the Kingdom of God in the name of Jesus Christ. The Scrip-

ture-based phrases are the words in italics.

These prompts suggest ways to intercede for our Church. Use the prayer prompts in a way that fits you. Listen to what God has to say through his Word and Spirit. Let God's words to you shape your words to him. The Spirit may also prompt you to add prayers of praise, thanks, confession or commitment related to these themes.

Preparation for Prayer

- Lord, I know that if I cherish sin in my heart, you will not listen to me (Ps. 66:18). So as I enter your presence I ask you to search me and know my heart; test me and know my anxious thoughts. See if there is any offensive way in me (Ps. 139:23-24). I will confess and forsake any and all sins that you make me aware of.
- Lord, I confess _____ asking that you forgive my sins and purify me from all unrighteousness (1 Jn. 1:9). I know that you will hear from heaven and forgive my sin, and will open your ears to my prayers (2 Chron. 7:14-15).
- Lord, help us not only to ask in accord with your will but to ask with right motives that our prayers will bring you glory, advance your kingdom, and accomplish your will on earth (1 Jn. 5:14-15, Jas. 4:2-3, Matt. 7:9-10).

Praise & Thanksgiving

- Praise the Lord, O my soul; all my inmost being, praise his holy name. Praise the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits. (forgiveness, healing, redemption, love, compassion, good things, renewal) (Ps. 103:1-5).
- Praise be to you, Lord . . . from everlasting to everlasting. Yours, Lord, is the greatness and the power and the glory and the majesty and the splendor, for everything in heaven and earth is yours. Yours, Lord, is the kingdom; you are exalted as head over all. Wealth and honor come from you; you are the ruler of all things. In your hands are strength and power to exalt and give strength to all. Now, our God, we give you thanks, and praise your glorious name (1 Chron. 29:10-13).

A Healthy Church

- Lord, make _____ Church healthy, like the church you founded—devoted to biblical teaching, to loving fellowship, to breaking of bread, and to prayer (Acts 2:42).
- Jesus Christ, I pray that you, by your Word and Spirit, will gather, protect and preserve many believers at _____ who will love and serve you wholeheartedly all the days of their lives (Heid. Catechism, Ques. 54).
- Lord, I pray that we may be brought to complete unity and may make every effort to keep

the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace (John 17:23, Eph. 4:3). Prepare us for works of service so that the body of Christ may be built up until we all reach unity in the faith and in the knowledge of the Son of God and become spiritually mature (Eph. 4:12-13).

Godly Leaders

- Lord, I pray that all our church leaders will receive from God himself everything they need for life and godliness, and will become servant leaders who, like Christ, are called not to be served but to serve (Matt. 20:26-28, 2 Pet. 1:3).
- Lord, I pray that all our church leaders will pay careful attention to themselves and to all the flock, in which the Holy Spirit has made them overseers, to care for the church of God, which he obtained with his own blood (Acts. 20:28).
- Lord, I pray that you will give wisdom and integrity to our pastors, elders, deacons and trustees that they may be mature in faith and will conduct their duties with prayer, patience and humility (Acts 6:4, 1Tim. 3:2-13).
- Lord, I pray that our staff will clearly discern God's vision for our church and will lead us according to his purposes. I pray that the Holy Spirit will give them the strength, courage, health, support and spiritual gifts to be fruitful (Prov. 3:5-6, Gal. 5:22-23, Eph. 5:18).

Spiritual Worship

- Lord, I pray that all of us at _____ Church will be the kind of worshipers that the Father seeks—true worshipers who worship him in spirit and truth (John 4:23-24).
- Lord, I pray that our pastor and all others who proclaim the gospel at _____ Church may be empowered by the Holy Spirit and enabled to preach the Word of God boldly and clearly—correcting, rebuking, and encouraging with great patience and careful instruction (Acts 1:8, 4:31, 1 Tim. 4:13, 2 Tim. 4:2).
- Lord, I pray that week by week we may. “Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name” (Psalms 100:4).
- Lord, I pray that you will be greatly honored in our worship as we ascribe to you the glory due your name; bring an offering and come before you; and worship you in the splendor of your holiness (1 Chr. 16:29).

Youth Education

- Lord, I pray that our parents will be able to train up their children and youths in the way they should go so that when they grow older they will not depart from that way (Prov. 22:6).
- Pray that we will be able to diligently teach our children the commands of God, talking

of them when we sit in your homes, and when we walk by the way, and when we lie down and rise up so that all our children will chose to live for Christ (Deut. 6:7).

- Lord, I pray that our youth workers will set an example in speech, life, love, faith and purity for those that they lead (1Tim. 4:12).
- Lord, I pray that teachers and counselors will communicate biblical truths clearly and faithfully so that children, teens and adults will be taught, reprovved, corrected and trained in righteousness and be thoroughly equipped for every good work (2 Tim. 3:16-17).
- Lord, I pray that you will give our young people the discernment and ability to choose the ways of wisdom over foolishness. I pray that they will remember their Creator in the days of their youth (Prov. 2:12-15, Eccl. 12:1, 2).
- Lord, I pray for our college students that the light of God's Word will shine through all that they learn. I pray that our young men and women who attend colleges and universities will learn to think noble thoughts and will be well-prepared to live godly lives (Ps. 119:105, Phil. 4:8).

Fellowship & Hospitality

- Lord, I pray that all our relationships may reflect the fact that we live lives of love, just as Christ loved us and gave himself for us as a fragrant offering to God (Eph. 5:2).
- Lord, I pray that we may make every effort to keep the unity of the Spirit through the bond of peace remembering that there is one body, one Spirit . . . one Lord, one faith, one baptism; one God and Father of all (Eph. 4:3-6).
- Lord, I pray that we all will be enabled to love each other deeply and to offer hospitality to others without grumbling and not forget to entertain strangers (Heb. 13:2, 1 Pet. 4:8-9).

Prayer in the Spirit

- Lord, I pray that we will heed the command of Christ to "Ask and it will be given you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives; he who seeks finds; and to him who knocks, the door will be opened (Matt. 7:7-8).
- Lord, enable us always to pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests . . . and, keeping in mind the devil's schemes, to always keep on praying for all the saints (Eph. 6:18).
- Lord, I pray that we may be devoted to prayer, and may be watchful and thankful. May our prayers open a door for the message of the gospel (Col. 4:2, 4).

- Lord, I pray that we will lay claim to the promise of Christ to do whatever we ask in his name, so that he may glory to the Father (John 1:12-14).
- Lord, I pray that we may live the kind of righteous lives that will enable us to pray powerful and effective prayers (James 5:16).

Witness to the World

- Lord, help us, by the power of your Holy Spirit, to be faithful witnesses in our neighbors, our town, our county, and to the ends of the earth (Acts 1:8).
- Lord, I pray that you will give us a burden for the lost and help us reach out to those who are like sheep without a shepherd (Matt. 16:18, John 10:16, Rom. 9:1-3). I pray that our light will shine before others so that they will see our good deeds and praise our Father in heaven (Mt. 5:16).
- Lord, I pray that we will obey the Spirit's promptings to make requests, prayers, intercession and thanksgivings for all people, knowing that this is good, and pleases God our Savior, who wants all people to be saved and to come to a knowledge of the truth (1 Tim. 2:1, 3-4).
- Lord, I pray that from the rising of the sun to its setting your name will be great among the nations, and in every place incense will be offered to your name, and a pure offering" (Mal. 1:11). Please raise up and send out workers into your harvest field (Matt. 9:38).
- Lord, I pray for our missionaries (_____, _____, _____) who bring the message of the gospel at home and abroad. I pray that they may make disciples of the nations and teach them to obey everything that Christ commanded (Matt. 28:19-20).

Daniel 7:9-10, “I watched till thrones were put in place, and the Ancient of Days was seated; his garment was white as snow, and the hair of His head was like pure wool. His throne was a fiery flame, its wheels a burning fire; A fiery stream issued and came forth from before Him. A thousand thousands ministered to Him; ten thousand times ten thousand stood before Him. The court was seated, and the books were opened.”

He is a good Father and gives Good gifts to His children

Psalms 32:8 (ESV), “I will instruct you and teach you in the way you should go; I will counsel you with my eye upon you.”

Anxious about facing opponents

Romans 8:31 (ESV), "What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?"

Deuteronomy 1:30 (ESV), "The LORD your God who goes before you will himself fight for you."

Anxious about the welfare of those I love

Matthew 7:11, "If I being evil know how to give good gifts to my children, how much more will, "Your Father in heaven give good things to those who ask him!"

Anxious about being sick

Psalms 34:19 (ESV), "Many are the afflictions of the righteous, but the LORD delivers him out of them all."

Anxiety about getting old and dying

Isaiah 46:4 (ESV), "even to your old age I am he, and to gray hairs I will carry you. I have made, and I will bear; I will carry and will save."

Romans 14:7-9 (ESV), "For none of us lives to himself, and none of us dies to himself. 8 For if we live, we live to the Lord, and if we die, we die to the Lord. So then, whether we live or whether we die, we are the Lord's. 9 For to this end Christ died and lived again, that he might be Lord both of the dead and of the living."

Anxiety about assurance of salvation or lack of conformity to Christ

Philippians 1:6 (ESV), "And I am sure of this, that he who began a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ."

1 Thessalonians 5:23-24 (ESV), "Now may the

God of peace himself sanctify you completely, and may your whole spirit and soul and body be kept blameless at the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ. He who calls you is faithful; he will surely do it."

Jude 24-25 (ESV), "Now to him who is able to keep you from stumbling and to present you blameless before the presence of his glory with great joy, 25 to the only God, our Savior, through Jesus Christ our Lord, be glory, majesty, dominion, and authority, before all time and now and forever. Amen."

Pride:

C.J. Mahaney writes, "Pride is our greatest enemy and humility is our greatest friend. Pride is when sinful human beings aspire to the status and position of God and refuse to acknowledge their dependence on him."

Pride is turning away from God to take satisfaction in self.

James 4:6 (ESV), "But he gives more grace. Therefore it says, "God opposes the proud, but gives grace to the humble."

Proverbs 16:18-19 (ESV), "Pride goes before destruction, and a haughty spirit before a fall. It is better to be of a lowly spirit with the poor than to divide the spoil with the proud."

Proverbs 8:13 (ESV), "The fear of the LORD is hatred of evil. Pride and arrogance and the way of evil and perverted speech I hate."

James 4:10 (ESV), "Humble yourselves before the Lord, and he will exalt you."

Isaiah 66:2 (ESV), "All these things my hand has made, and so all these things came to be, declares the LORD. But this is the one to

whom I will look: he who is humble and contrite in spirit and trembles at my word.”

2 Chronicles 7:14 (ESV), “If my people who are called by my name humble themselves, and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven and will forgive their sin and heal their land.”

Impatience:

James 5:7-11 (ESV), “Be patient, therefore, brothers, until the coming of the Lord. See how the farmer waits for the precious fruit of the earth, being patient about it, until it receives the early and the late rains. 8 You also, be patient. Establish your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is at hand. 9 Do not grumble against one another, brothers, so that you may not be judged; behold, the Judge is standing at the door. 10 As an example of suffering and patience, brothers, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord. 11 Behold, we consider those blessed who remained steadfast. You have heard of the steadfastness of Job, and you have seen the purpose of the Lord, how the Lord is compassionate and merciful.”

Lamentations 3:25 (ESV), “The LORD is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him.”

Romans 8:35-37 (ESV), “Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? Covetousness/Jealousy/Envy

Def. Covetousness is desiring something so much that you lose your contentment in God. Covetous is seeking to find satisfaction in things.

Philippians 4:11-13 (ESV), “Not that I am speaking of being in need, for I have learned in whatever situation I am to be content. 12 I know how to be brought low, and I know how to abound. In any and every circumstance, I have learned the secret of facing plenty and hunger, abundance and need. 13 I can do all things through him who strengthens me.”

1 Timothy 6:6 (ESV), “Now there is great gain in godliness with contentment,”

Hebrews 13:5-6 (ESV), “Keep your life free from love of money, and be content with what you have, for he has said, “I will never leave you nor forsake you.” 6 So we can confidently say, “The Lord is my helper; I will not fear; what can man do to me?”

Luke 12:15 (ESV), “And he said to them, “Take

care, and be on your guard against all covetousness, for one’s life does not consist in the abundance of his possessions.”

Ecclesiastes 5:10 (ESV), “He who loves money will not be satisfied with money, nor he who loves wealth with his income; this also is vanity.”

Psalms 119:36 (ESV), “Incline my heart to your testimonies, and not to selfish gain!”

James 3:16 (ESV), “For where jealousy and selfish ambition exist, there will be disorder and every vile practice.”

Bitterness and Unforgiveness

Bitterness is seeking to find satisfaction in revenge. The more you rejoice in your own forgiveness, the quicker you will be able to forgive others!

“The promise that frees us from an unforgiving, bitter, vengeful spirit is the promise that God will settle our accounts.”—John Piper

Ephesians 4:30-32 (ESV), “And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption. ³¹ Let all bitterness and wrath and anger and clamor and slander be put away from you, along with all malice. ³² Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, as God in Christ forgave you.”

Hebrews 12:14-15 (ESV), “Strive for peace with everyone, and for the holiness without which no one will see the Lord. ¹⁵ See to it that no one fails to obtain the grace of God; that no “root of bitterness” springs up and causes trouble, and by it many become defiled;”

Matthew 6:14-15 (NIV), “For if you forgive men when they sin against you, your heavenly Father will also forgive you. 15 But if you do not forgive men their sins, your Father will not forgive your sins.”

Romans 12:19 (NIV), “Do not take revenge, my friends, but leave room for God’s wrath, for it is written: “It is mine to avenge; I will repay,” says the Lord.

Speech/Judgement/Gossip

James 3:8-12 (ESV), “but no human being can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison. 9 With it we bless our Lord and Father, and with it we curse people who are made in the likeness of God. 10 From the same mouth come blessing and cursing. My brothers, these things ought not to be so.

¹¹ Does a spring pour forth from the same opening both fresh and salt water? 12 Can a fig tree, my brothers, bear olives, or a grapevine produce figs? Neither can a salt pond yield fresh water.”

Matthew 12:36-37 (ESV), “I tell you, on the day of judgment people will give account for every careless word they speak, ³⁷ for by your words you will be justified, and by your words you will be condemned.”

Ephesians 4:29 (ESV), “Let no corrupting talk come out of your mouths, but only such as is good for building up, as fits the occasion, that it may give grace to those who hear.”

Proverbs 18:21 (ESV), “Death and life are in the power of the tongue, and those who love it will eat its fruits.”

Proverbs 15:1 (ESV), “A soft answer turns away wrath, but a harsh word stirs up anger.”

Lust is seeking to find satisfaction in sex outside of marriage.

“The fight of faith against lust is the fight to stay satisfied with God. ‘By faith Moses forsook the fleeting pleasures of sin. He...was looking for the reward.’ Faith is not content with fleeting pleasures. It is ravenous for joy! We must fight it with a massive promise of

superior happiness. We must swallow up the little flicker of lusts pleasures in holy satisfaction, all God wants to be to us in Christ! When we 'make a covenant with our eyes,' it is not merely to avoid something erotic, but it is also to gain something excellent"—John Piper

Matthew 5:28-29 (ESV), "But I say to you that everyone who looks at a woman with lustful intent has already committed adultery with her in his heart. 29 If your right eye causes you to sin, tear it out and throw it away. For it is better that you lose one of your members than that your whole body be thrown into hell."

1 Peter 2:11 (ESV), "Beloved, I urge you as sojourners and exiles to abstain from the passions of the flesh, which wage war against your soul."

Job 31:1 (NIV), "I made a covenant with my eyes not to look lustfully at a girl."

Matthew 5:8 (NIV), "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God."

Hebrews 12:14 (NIV), "without holiness no one will see the Lord."

1 Thessalonians 4:1-5 (ESV), "For this is the will of God, your sanctification: that you abstain from sexual immorality; that each one of you know how to control his own body in holiness and honor, not in the passion of lust like the Gentiles who do not know God;

Leviticus 18:17 (ESV), "You shall not uncover the nakedness of a woman and of her daughter,"

Proverbs 5:18-19 (NIV), "May your fountain be

blessed, and may you rejoice in the wife of your youth. 19 A loving doe, a graceful deer—may her breasts satisfy you always, may you ever be captivated by her love."

Psalms 16:11, "You make known to me the path of life; in your presence there is fullness of joy; at your right hand are pleasures forevermore."

1 Cor. 6:13b-20, "The body is not meant for sexual immorality, but for the Lord, and the Lord for the body...And God raised the Lord and will also raise us up by his power. Do you not know that your bodies are members of Christ? Shall I then take the members of Christ and make them members of a prostitute? Never! Or do you not know that he who is joined to a prostitute becomes one body with her? For, as it is written, 'the two will become one flesh.' But he who is joined to the Lord becomes one spirit with him. Flee from sexual immorality. Every other sin a person commits is outside the body, but the sexually immoral person sins against his own body. Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price. So glorify God in your body."

Fear and Insecurity

John 14:1-2 (NIV), "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God; trust also in me. In my Father's house are many rooms; if it were not so, I would have told you. I am going there to prepare a place for you."

John 14:27 (NIV), "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled and do not be afraid."

Psalms 27:1 (NIV), “The LORD is my light and my salvation— whom shall I fear? The LORD is the stronghold of my life— of whom shall I be afraid?”

Psalms 91:1 (NIV), “He who dwells in the shelter of the Most High will rest in the shadow of the Almighty.”

Psalms 91:7-10 (NIV), “A thousand may fall at your side, ten thousand at your right hand, but it will not come near you. 8 You will only observe with your eyes and see the punishment of the wicked. 9 If you make the Most High your dwelling— even the LORD, who is my refuge— 10 then no harm will befall you, no disaster will come near your tent.”

Matthew 10:28 (NIV), “Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. Rather, be afraid of the One who can destroy both soul and body in hell.

Psalms 18:1-3 (NIV), “I love you, O LORD, my strength. 2 The LORD is my rock, my fortress and my deliverer; my God is my rock, in whom I take refuge. He is my shield and the horn of my salvation, my stronghold. 3 I call to the LORD, who is worthy of praise, and I am saved from my enemies.”

Psalms 46:1-2 (NIV), “God is our refuge and strength, an ever-present help in trouble. 2 Therefore we will not fear,”

Joshua 1:9 (NIV), “Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous. Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the LORD your God will be with you wherever you go.”

Revelation 1:17-18 (NIV), “Then he placed his right hand on me and said: “Do not be afraid. I am the First and the Last. 18 I am the Living One; I was dead, and behold I am alive for ever and ever! And I hold the keys of death and Hades.”

Disappointment/Despondency/Discouragement/Depression

Psalms 73:26 (NIV), “My flesh and my heart may fail, but God is the strength of my heart and my portion forever.”

Matthew 11:28-29 (NIV), “Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. 29 Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls.”

Isaiah 61:3 (NIV), “and provide for those who grieve in Zion— to bestow on them a crown of beauty instead of ashes, the oil of gladness instead of mourning, and a garment of praise instead of a spirit of despair. They will be called oaks of righteousness, a planting of the LORD for the display of his splendor.”

Isaiah 40:29-31 (NIV), “He gives strength to the weary and increases the power of the weak. 30 Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall; 31 but those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary, they will walk and not be faint.”

Psalms 139:11-12 (NIV), “If I say, “Surely the darkness will hide me and the light become night around me,” 12 even the darkness will not be dark to you; the night will shine like the day, for darkness is as light to you.”

Psalm 23 (NIV), “The LORD is my shepherd, I shall not be in want. 2 He makes me lie down in green pastures, he leads me beside quiet waters, 3 he restores my soul. He guides me in paths of righteousness for his name’s sake. 4 Even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. 5 You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies. You anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. 6 Surely goodness and love will follow me all the days of my life, and I will dwell in the house of the LORD forever.”

Meditating on the Cross of Christ

Luke 22:14-20 (ESV),

“And when the hour came, he reclined at table, and the apostles with him. And he said to them, “I have earnestly desired to eat this Passover with you before I suffer. For I tell you I will not eat it until it is fulfilled in the kingdom of God.” And he took a cup, and when he had given thanks he said, “Take this, and divide it among yourselves. For I tell you that from now on I will not drink of the fruit of the vine until the kingdom of God comes.” And he took bread, and when he had given thanks, he broke it and gave it to them, saying, “This is my body, which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me.” And likewise the cup after they had eaten, saying, “This cup that is poured out for you is the new covenant in my blood.”

Isaiah 53:3-7 (ESV), “He was despised and rejected by men; a man of sorrows, and acquainted with grief; and as one from whom men hide their faces he was despised, and we esteemed him not.”

⁴ Surely he has borne our griefs and carried our sorrows; yet we esteemed him stricken, smitten by God, and afflicted.

⁵ But he was wounded for our transgressions; he was crushed for our iniquities; upon him was the chastisement that brought us peace, and with his stripes we are healed.

⁶ All we like sheep have gone astray; we have turned everyone to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all.

⁷ He was oppressed, and he was afflicted, yet he opened not his mouth; like a lamb that is led to the slaughter, and like a sheep that before its shearers is silent, so he opened not

his mouth....Yet it was the will of the LORD to crush him; he has put him to grief; when his soul makes an offering for sin," Therefore I will divide him a portion with the many, and he shall divide the spoil with the strong, because he poured out his soul to death and was numbered with the transgressors; yet he bore the sin of many, and makes intercession for the transgressors.

Psalm 22:1 (ESV),

"My God, my God, why have you forsaken me? Why are you so far from saving me, from the words of my groaning?"

But I am a worm and not a man, scorned by mankind and despised by the people. All who see me mock me; they make mouths at me; they wag their heads; "He trusts in the LORD; let him deliver him; let him rescue him, for he delights in him!"

I am poured out like water, and all my bones are out of joint; my heart is like wax; it is melted within my breast; my strength is dried up like a potsherd, and my tongue sticks to my jaws; you lay me in the dust of death. For dogs encompass me; a company of evildoers encircles me; they have pierced my hands and feet— I can count all my bones— they stare and gloat over me; they divide my garments among them, and for my clothing they cast lots."

Isaiah 50:6 (ESV), "I gave my back to those who strike, and my cheeks to those who pull out the beard; I hid not my face from disgrace and spitting.

The Glory of the Lamb

Imagine the Highest stoops to become the lowest, the Greatest becomes the least, the

King becomes a criminal! The Lord of all because the servant of all, The Creator becomes the Crucified, the Powerful one becomes the Pierced One

Revelation 5:6 (ESV), "And between the throne and the four living creatures and among the elders I saw a Lamb standing, as though it had been slain,"

Cross Meditation

- Roman Scourging-39 stripes
- Crown of Thorns and Purple Robe ripped from his flesh
- Beard was ripped out, Isa. 50:6
- Nakedness, Shame, Mocking, Beating, Spitting
- Carrying His Cruel Cross, smells, dust, heat
- Physical Exhaustion(no sleep), Thirst and Dehydration
- Demonic Attack and Temptation
- Loneliness, everyone left him, including His Father(last 3 hours)
- Pierced Hands and Feet
- 7 Cries from the Cross:
 1. A Cry of Pardon
Luke 23:34 (ESV), "And Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they know not what they do." And they cast lots to divide his garments."
 2. A Cry of Assurance

Luke 23:43 (ESV), “And he said to him, “Truly, I say to you, today you will be with me in Paradise.”

3. A Cry of Compassion

John 19:26-27 (ESV), “When Jesus saw his mother and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to his

mother, “Woman, behold, your son!” 27

Then he said to the disciple, “Behold, your mother!” And from that hour the disciple took her to his own home.”

4. A Cry of Anguish

Matthew 27:46 (ESV), “And about the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, “Eli, Eli, lema sabachthani?” that is, “My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?”

5. A Cry of Suffering

John 19:28 (ESV), “After this, Jesus, knowing that all was now finished, said (to fulfill the Scripture), “I thirst.”

6. A Cry of Victory

John 19:30 (ESV), “When Jesus had received the sour wine, he said, “It is finished,” and he bowed his head and gave up his spirit.

7. A Cry of Submission

Luke 23:46 (ESV), “Then Jesus, calling out with a loud voice, said, “Father, into your hands I commit my spirit!” And having said this he breathed his last.

- Taking on Sin on our behalf, 2 Cor. 5:21

2 Corinthians 5:21 (ESV), “For our sake he made him to be sin who knew no sin, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.”

- Taking on our griefs, sorrows, pain, abuse, etc.

- Taking on our WRATH, death, and the eternal Flames of Hell in our place: His Wrath was averted and placed on Jesus Christ as our substitute and now the Father is satisfied.

- Pierced Side, blood and water (Spirit) flowed out.

John 19:33-37 (ESV), “But when they came to Jesus and saw that he was already dead, they did not break his legs. But one of the soldiers pierced his side with a spear, and at once there came out blood and water. He who saw it has borne witness— his testimony is true, and he knows that he is telling the truth— that you also may believe. For these things took place that the Scripture might be fulfilled: “Not one of his bones will be broken.” And again another Scripture says, “They will look on him whom they have pierced.”

1. Blood of the Lamb,

400 references to blood, 1300 references to the atonement

- He sweated drops of blood
- He bled from beatings to His Face
- He bled from having His beard ripped out
- He bled from the scourging
- He bled from a crown of thorns crushed into his head
- He bled from nails driven through his hands and feet
- He bled from a Roman spear piercing his side

2. Deliverance in the blood of the Lamb

We have protection under the covering of

the blood. Exodus 12:13 (ESV), "The blood shall be a sign for you, on the houses where you are. And when I see the blood, I will pass over you, and no plague will befall you to destroy you, when I strike the land of Egypt."

We have salvation, forgiveness, and redemption in the blood. Hebrews 9:22 (ESV), "Indeed, under the law almost everything is purified with blood, and without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness of sins." Ephesians 1:7 (NIV), "In him we have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of sins, in accordance with the riches of God's grace."

There is life, healing, and provision in the blood. Isaiah 53:5 (NIV), "But he was pierced for our transgressions, he was crushed for our iniquities; the punishment that brought us peace was upon him, and by his wounds we are healed."

Psalms 105:37 (NKJV), "He also brought them out with silver and gold, and there was none feeble (sick) among His tribes."

There is justification in the blood of Jesus. Romans 5:9 (NKJV), "Much more then, having now been justified by His blood, we shall be saved from wrath through Him."

There is sanctification in the blood of Jesus. Hebrews 13:12 (NKJV), "Therefore Jesus also, that He might sanctify the people with His own blood, suffered outside the gate."

There is peace under the covering of the blood. Colossians 1:19-20 (NKJV), "For it pleased the Father that in Him all the fullness should dwell, 20 and by Him to reconcile all things to Himself, by Him, whether things on earth or things in heaven, having made peace through the blood of His cross."

There is washing in the blood. Revelation 1:5 (NKJV), "To Him who loved us and washed us from our sins in His own blood,"

There is overcoming in the power of the blood of the Lamb. Revelation 12:11 (NKJV), "And they overcame him by the blood of the Lamb and by the word of their testimony, and they did not love their lives to the death."

There is accessibility in the blood, allowing us into the presence of God.

Hebrews 10:19 (NKJV), "Therefore, brethren, having boldness to enter the Holiest by the blood of Jesus,"

My body is a temple of the Holy Spirit, redeemed, cleansed, justified and sanctified. Through the Blood of Jesus every curse for disobedience is broken.

Through the Blood of Jesus every blessing of obedience is mine! Through the Blood of Jesus the way to perpetual communion with the Father has been opened and no man can shut it. Through the Blood of Jesus I am heir and possessor of all the riches of my Father's eternal Kingdom. The Blood of Jesus speaks for me today from the mercy seat of God's throne in Heaven.

Therefore, the devil has no place in me, no

power over me, no unsettled claims against me. I overcome the world, the flesh and the devil through the Blood of Jesus!

Exalted Lamb of Glory

Jesus went from wearing a cruel crown of thorns to wearing a golden crown of Glory, from Robes dipped in blood to a Kingly Robe of Splendor, from a mock scepter in his hand to a scepter of authority, from the insults of men to the worship of angels, from the filth of sin to the beauty of holiness... See his head and hair, once soaked in blood, now dazzling white as snow... See the One whose eyes stung and dripped blood, tears of sorrow, now Blazing Like Fire, like Flames of torches, See the Face, once swollen and raw from patches of His beard torn out, Now his shines shining brighter than the Sun in all its brilliance... See his body, once stripped naked, now clothed in Eternal majesty... see his hands pierced, now bleeding infinite splendor, feet once spiked to a stake of timber, now gleaming like burnished bronze... his side once pierced and now Hear HIM SAY, "This Wound in my Heart is For YOU!

Every Wound Bleeds Glory! Glory that flows from Him, and through Him, and Back to Him!

From Victim to Victor,
From worm to Warrior,
From humiliation to glorification,
From tortured to Triumphant,
From degradation to exaltation,
From a lowly bleeding Lamb to a glorified Lion-Lamb!

He's the One from Whom Glory flows, He's the Central Sun in the universe, he's the Dazzling One, the Outstanding One, He's the Chandelier of Heaven, and He's the Well Spring of Eternity, the Fountainhead of Glory!

Revelation 5:11-12 (ESV), "saying with a loud voice, "Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!"

- I am a bold witness for Christ because He has made me righteous. 2 Cor 3:11-12 For if what is passing away was glorious, what remains is much more glorious. Therefore, since we have such hope, we use great boldness of speech.”
- United to Him in Love, I am the bride of Jesus Christ. Ephesians 5:25-32 Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ also loved the church and gave Himself for her, that He might sanctify and cleanse her with the washing of water by the word, that He might present her to Himself a glorious church, not having spot or wrinkle or any such thing, but that she should be holy and without blemish.” I Cor 6:17 But he who is joined to the Lord is one spirit with Him.”
- I am part of a chosen generation, a royal priesthood. I Peter 2:9 But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may

proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light.”

- I am a citizen of a holy nation and one of His own special people. I Peter 2:9 But you are a chosen generation, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, His own special people, that you may proclaim the praises of Him who called you out of darkness into His marvelous light.”
- I am an heir of God and a joint heir with Christ Jesus. Romans 8:16-17 The Spirit Himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs--heirs of God and joint heirs with Christ, if indeed we suffer with Him, that we may also be glorified together.”
- “As a member of God’s family, I am also Abraham’s seed and an heir according to the promises made to Abraham. Galatians 3:14 that the blessing of Abraham might come upon the Gentiles in Christ Jesus, that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith.”
- “I am a member of the household of God. Ephesians 2:19 Now, therefore, you are no longer strangers and foreigners, but fellow citizens with the saints and members of the household of God.”
- “As a child of the Most High God, I am led by His Spirit. Romans 8:14-15 For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God. For you did not receive the spirit of bondage again to fear, but you received the Spirit of adoption by whom we cry out, “Abba, Father.”
- “I am a child of the light, a child of the

day. Ephesians 5:8-9 For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Walk as children of light (for the fruit of the Spirit is in all goodness, righteousness, and truth).”

- With Christ’s light in me, I am the light of the world. Matthew 5:14-16 “You are the light of the world. A city that is set on a hill cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and put it under a basket, but on a lamp-stand, and it gives light to all who are in the house. Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.”
- My life brings divine flavor wherever I go for I am the salt of the earth. Matthew 5:13 “You are the salt of the earth; but if the salt loses its flavor, how shall it be seasoned? It is then good for nothing but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot by men.”
- “God has chosen me to be one of His own, because he wanted Me; Jesus has embraced me as His disciple. John 15:16 You did not choose Me, but I chose you and appointed you that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain, that whatever you ask the Father in My name He may give you.”
- “In His word, God has called me a priest and a king. Revelation 1:4-6 John, to the seven churches which are in Asia: Grace to you and peace from Him who is and who was and who is to come, and from the seven Spirits who are before His throne, and from Jesus Christ, the faithful witness, the firstborn from the dead, and the ruler over the kings of the earth. To Him who loved us and washed us from our sins in His own

blood, and has made us kings and priests to His God and Father, to Him be glory and dominion forever and ever. Amen.”

- I am an ambassador, one of Christ’s representatives, in this world. 2 Corinthians 5:20 Now then, we are ambassadors for Christ, as though God were pleading through us: we implore you on Christ’s behalf, be reconciled to God.
- My Life is Hidden in Christ and I am seated in heavenly places. Colossians 3:1-4 If then you were raised with Christ, seek those things which are above, where Christ is, sitting at the right hand of God. Set your mind on things above, not on things on the earth. For you died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ who is our life appears, then you also will appear with Him in glory, Ephesians 2:6 and raised us up together, and made us sit together in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus.
- “God is for me! Romans 8:31 What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who can be against us?”
- The Fruit of the Spirit is displayed in my life!
“His kindness and goodness work powerfully through me. Galatians 5:22-24 But the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, long-suffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control. Against such there is no law. And those who are Christ’s have crucified the flesh with its passions and desires.”
- I am baptized in the Holy Spirit and clothed with power from on High! Acts 1:8 But you shall receive power when the Holy

Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth.” Luke 24:49, “I am going to send you what my Father has promised; but stay in the city until you have been clothed with power from on high”

- I am healed by his stripes! Matthew 8:16-17, “When evening had come, they brought to Him many who were demon- possessed. And He cast out the spirits with a word, and healed all who were sick, that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by Isaiah the prophet, saying: “He Himself took our infirmities And bore our sicknesses.”
- I am strong in the Lord, having overcome the wicked one and the world. I John 2:14 I have written to you, fathers, because you have known Him who is from the beginning. I have written to you, young men, because you are strong, and the word of God abides in you, And you have overcome the wicked one.

Apostolic Prayers & Prophetic Promises —

Prayer for revelation of Jesus’ beauty that we might walk in our calling and destiny by God’s power:

That the Father of glory, may give to you the spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him, the eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that you may

KNOW (experience) what is the hope of His calling (assurance/ clarity of God’s call for our life) what are the riches of the glory of His inheritance in the saints (our destiny as Jesus’ inheritance), and what is the exceeding greatness of His power toward us who believe, according to the working of His mighty power... (Eph. 1:17-19)

Prayer to receive the Spirit’s power that Jesus’ presence be manifest in us so we experience God’s love:

¹⁶ THAT He would grant you, according to the riches of His glory, to be strengthened with might through His Spirit in the inner man, ¹⁷ THAT Christ may dwell (manifest His presence) in your hearts through faith; THAT you, being rooted and grounded in love, ¹⁸ may be able to comprehend (experience) with all the saints what is the width and length and depth and height— ¹⁹ to know the love of Christ which passes knowledge; THAT you may be filled with all the fullness of God. (Eph. 3:16-19)

Prayer for God’s love to abound in us by the knowledge of God resulting in righteousness in our life:

⁹ That your love may abound still more and more in knowledge (of God) and all discernment, ¹⁰ that you may approve (rejoice in) the things that are excellent, that you may be sincere (no compromise) and without offense till the day of Christ, ¹¹ being filled with the fruits of righteousness (Phil. 1:9-11)

Prayer to know God’s will, to be fruitful in ministry and strengthened by intimacy with God:

⁹ That you may be filled with the knowledge of His will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding; ¹⁰ that you may have a walk

worthy of the Lord, fully pleasing Him, being fruitful in every good work and increasing in the knowledge of God; 11 strengthened with all might, according to His glorious power, for all patience and longsuffering with joy... (Col. 1:9- 11)

Prayer for unity in the church and to be filled with supernatural joy, peace and hope (confidence):

⁵ May the God of patience and comfort grant you to be like-minded toward one another...⁶ that you may with one mind and one mouth glorify the...Father...¹³ May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that you may abound in hope by the power of the Holy Spirit. (Rom. 15:5-6, 13)

Prayer to be enriched by all the gifts of the Spirit including powerful preaching and prophetic revelation:

⁵ That you were enriched in everything by Him in all utterance (anointed preaching/singing) and all knowledge (prophetic revelation), ⁶ even as the testimony of Christ was confirmed in you (by miracles), ⁷ so that you come short in no gift, eagerly waiting for the revelation of...Jesus Christ, ⁸ who will also confirm you to the end, that you may be blameless in the day of our Lord Jesus Christ. (1 Cor. 1:5-8)

Prayer for the release of grace to bring the church to maturity especially to abound in love and holiness:

¹⁰ Praying exceedingly that... (God will) perfect what is lacking in your faith...¹² And may the Lord make you increase and abound in love to one another and to all... ¹³ that He may establish your hearts blameless in holiness before our God and Father. (1 Thes. 3:10-13)

Pray to be worthy (prepared or made spiritually mature) to walk in the fullness of our destiny in God:

¹¹ We pray always for you that God would count you worthy of (prepare us for) this calling, and fulfill all the good pleasure of His goodness (plans for us) and the work of faith with power, ¹² that the name of...Jesus may be glorified in you, and you in Him, according to the grace of our God. (2 Thes. 1:11-12)

Prayer that the word will increase its influence (effectiveness) in the city as God releases His power on it:

¹ Pray for us, that the Word of the Lord may run swiftly (rapidly increase its influence) and be glorified (confirmed with apostolic power and miracles), just as it is with you...³ The Lord is faithful, who will establish you and guard you from the evil one...⁵ May the Lord direct your hearts into the love of God and into the patience perseverance or endurance) of Christ. (2 Thes. 3:1-5)

Prayer for release of God's promise of power for all who tarry (labor in prayer) for breakthrough:

⁴⁹ Behold, I send the Promise of My Father upon you; but tarry in the city of Jerusalem until you are endued with power from on high." (Luke 24:49) ⁸ But you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be witnesses to Me in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the end of the earth." (Acts 1:8)

Prayer for impartation of boldness (singing & speaking the word) by releasing healing, signs & wonders:

²⁹ Lord...grant to Your servants that with all boldness they may speak Your word, ³⁰ by

stretching out Your hand to heal, and that signs and wonders may be done through the name of Your holy Servant Jesus. 31 And when they had prayed, the place where they were assembled together was shaken; and they were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and they spoke the word of God with boldness. (Acts 4:29-31)

For the Lord to release His zeal for His people and for His manifest presence to shake all that resists Him:

¹⁵ Look down...and see from Your habitation, holy and glorious. Where are (the manifestations of) Your zeal and Your strength, the yearning of Your heart and Your mercies toward me? ¹⁶...You, O LORD, are our Father; Our Redeemer from Everlasting is Your name. 64:1 Oh, that You would rend the heavens! That You would come down (manifest Your power)! That the mountains (obstacles) might shake at Your presence 2 as fire burns brushwood, as fire causes water to boil-- to make Your name known to Your adversaries (sin, sickness, Satan), that the nations may tremble at Your presence! 3 When You did awesome things for which we did not look (expect)... 4 Since the beginning of the world men have not heard...nor has the eye seen any God besides You, who acts for the one who waits for Him. 5 You meet him who rejoices and does righteousness, who remembers You in Your ways. (Isa. 63:15-16; 64:1-7)

Prayer for God to release anointed laborers into the harvest to minister to the flock and to win the lost:

Then He said to His disciples, "The harvest truly is plentiful, but the laborers are few. 38 Therefore pray the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into His harvest." (Matthew 9:37,38)

Prayer for unity in the church that the world would see and believe that Jesus was sent by the Father:

²⁰ "I do not pray for these alone, but also for those who will believe in Me through their word; 21 that they all may be one, as You, Father, are in Me, and I in You; that they also may be one in Us, that the world may believe that You sent Me. 22 And the glory which You gave Me I have given them, that they may be one just as We are one: 23 I in them, and You in Me; that they may be made perfect in one, and that the world may know that You have sent Me, and have loved them as You have loved Me. ²⁴ "Father, I desire that they also whom You gave Me may be with Me where I am, that they may behold My glory which You have given Me; for You loved Me before the foundation of the world. 25 O righteous Father! The world has not known You, but I have known You; and these have known that You sent Me. 26 And I have declared to them Your name, and will declare it, that the love with which You loved Me may be in them, and I in them." (John 17:20-26)

Prayer for Israel to be saved and the release of the prophetic anointing, miracles and righteousness

¹ My heart's desire and prayer to God for Israel is that they may be saved. (Rom. 10:1)

²⁶ All Israel will be saved...The Deliverer (Jesus) will come out of Zion. He will turn away ungodliness from Jacob; 27 For this is My covenant with them, when I take away their sins. (Rom. 11:26-27)

¹ For Zion's sake I will not hold My peace (or be silent: release a prophetic spirit), and for

Jerusalem's sake I will not rest (or I will not be inactive: release power), UNTIL her righteousness (in all heart issues) goes forth as brightness, and her salvation as a lamp that burns (ministry to others). (Isa. 62:1)

John 17 –Praying with Jesus

John 17 –Praying with Jesus
Jesus aware of his timeframe, just hours before the cross, prays his most intense prayer to the Father. He prays for himself, for his disciples, and for all disciples who would believe in him through their message. Jesus has four specific prayer requests to the Father. All

four of these requests Jesus made twice in the prayer. Let's follow Jesus in his footsteps as we pray these four things for our families, churches, and community.

Father, 'Glorify your Son'

(V1, 5). At the heart of all prayer is that the name of Jesus would be exalted. We pray that his name would be treated as infinitely valuable on earth as it is in heaven. We pray that his name would be 'revealed' and 'revered' As David Bryant says, "the fame of Jesus' name ratifies His claim to fully carry-out his reign, which is all to Heaven's gain, and therefore ours as well"--David Bryant

Father 'Protect them, keep them from the evil one in your name'

(V11, 15). Jesus knew that there was an evil one, an enemy who comes to steal, kill and destroy. This is not a neutral world. Satan wants to destroy the things the Father loves. However, Jesus prays on our behalf as our faithful high priest, and advocate. Pray for the same for your family members, and fellow believers.

Father 'Sanctify them,'

(V17, 19). Jesus prays, "Father I ask that you would sanctify them in truth, Your Word is truth." The process of sanctification is 'becoming like Jesus.' It is both a separation from participating in and being influenced by evil and growth in holiness in both attitudes and actions. We become like Jesus as we believe and live according to 'the truth' of God's Word. Truth here is a noun (the truth), meaning God's Word is the standard against which everything else must be tested and compared. Get into the Word of God until the Word of God gets into you.

Father 'Unite them'

(V21, 23). Jesus prays, "Father may they would be one even as you and I are one." Why? Jesus gives two "SO THAT'S" First, he longs for body of Christ to walk in unity, so that the world out there might know that Father sent His Son for them. Second, that the world will know that the Father loves them just as much as he loves his Son, the Lord Jesus! Jesus reveals to us one of the most powerful strategies to reach the lost as we come together in Christ, nations, denominations, and generations!

Personal Prayer Tools

10 prayers to receive strength in the inner man: F-E-L-L-O-W-S-H-I-P

F - Fear of God: Release the spirit of the fear of God into my heart (Ps. 86:11)

E - Endurance Strengthen my spirit with endurance to do Your will (Col. 1:11)

L - Love: Father, pour out Your love into my heart (Phil. 1:9; Eph. 3:16-19) **L** - Light of glory: Let me see the light of Your glory (Acts 22:6-11; Ex. 33:18; Ps. 4:6)

O - One thing life focus: Help me be a person of one thing who sits at Your feet (Ps. 27:4, Lk. 10:42)

W - Walk worthy: Strengthen me to have a

worthy response to Your grace (2 Thes. 1:11; Lk. 21:36)

S - Speech: Set a guard over my lips. Free me from sinful speech (Eph. 4:29; Ps. 141:3)

H - Humility: Jesus, I want to learn from You how to walk in lowliness (Mt. 11:29).

I - Insight unto intimacy: Give me insight into Your Word, will, and ways (Col. 1:9)

P - Peace and Joy: Strengthen my heart with peace and joy that overpowers fear (Phil. 4:7; Rom. 15:13)

5 prayers to help in fellowshiping with the Holy Spirit: T-R-U-S-T

T - Thank You recognize the Spirit's indwelling presence in you simply by thanking Him for it. Pray, "Thank you Holy Spirit, for Your bright presence in me. I love Your presence. Apart from connecting with You, I can do nothing that effectively (supernaturally) renews my love, sustains my zeal for righteousness, and releases revelation and power in my heart. He who abides in Me, and I in him, bears much fruit; for without Me you can do nothing. (Jn. 15:5)

R - Release Revelation ask (thank) the Spirit to release abundant revelation of God's heart, word and purposes to you. Pray, Holy Spirit, release abundant revelation in me". "May give to you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation in the knowledge of Him (Eph 1:17)

U - Use Me ask the Spirit to use you more and more in the spiritual gifts to minister to others. We pray, Thank you Spirit, for releasing the manifestation of Your gifts and power

through me to help others". (1 Cor 12:7)

S – Strengthen Me ask the Spirit to strengthen your mind, emotions and speech with His might. His power is already in us (Gal. 5:22-23) therefore, pray, "Thank you for the presence of your love, peace, patience, and self-control in me" or "Thank You for warring against my flesh and guarding my speech" To be strengthened with might through His Spirit in the inner man (Eph. 3:16)

T – Teach Me ask the Spirit to teach you about God's will and ways that He may manifest His leadership in every issue in your life including finances, schedule, circumstances, emotions, physical body (diet/health), relationships, alignment of the people you are responsible for (in the home, office, ministry), future, greatness in God, opportunities with divine appointments, fears, addictions and shortcomings. Ask that He establish God's order in your home, job and ministry. We pray, "Spirit, I love Your will and ways, therefore, manifest Your leadership in me". He will give us new ideas, order our steps and open doors of opportunity for strategic alliances in each area of our life as we ask Him. The Holy Spirit... will teach you all things (John 14:6) (see also Jn. 16:13; 1 Jn 2:27)
